







# Report 2016

The Reading Hour is one of the most celebrated annual reading initiatives in Australia, and supports individuals, families and communities to discover and rediscover the joy of reading.

The Reading Hour emerged from the National Year of Reading 2012, and is an ongoing campaign from Love2Read, funded by the ALIA Australian Public Library Alliance and in partnership with the Copyright Agency Cultural Fund.

The Reading Hour reminds parents, caregivers and families that reading together doesn't have to be a massive undertaking in their increasingly busy lives, but rather encourages the 'anytime, anywhere' mantra, building a foundation in society whereby reading is a gift, given freely.



The Reading Hour aims to spread the simple message,

# 'Share a book with your child for 10 minutes a day, an hour a week, and give the gift of reading'.

With our key mission statement being:

'Anytime is Reading Time!'



Driven by Australian libraries, Love2Read raises the status and visibility of reading and literacy nationwide, promotes the benefits of reading and storytelling as critical life skills and catalysts for wellbeing, and unifies the national literacy network.

The Reading Hour provides an opportunity for libraries, authors, illustrators, educators and other professionals to work together towards the goal of Australia being a nation of readers.



## **Objectives**

- Raise awareness and visibility of reading in Australian homes and classrooms.
- Support the shared goals of schools, parents, and educational bodies in raising and steadily promoting the value of reading.
- Be an on-going and consistent reading resource for parents, teachers, and caregivers, by connecting them with a network of libraries and other reading organisations.
- Continue to strengthen Australia's reading culture, driving the consumption of books and literature.



# 2016 National Ambassador: Magda Szubanski



One of Australia's most loved TV personalities; Magda Szubanski has a background in comedy, appearing on several sketch shows including *Kath & Kim* as Sharon Strzelecki. Her first book *Reckoning* recently won the Indie Award for Non-Fiction, Douglas Stewart Prize for Non-Fiction at the NSW Premier's Literary Awards and both Biography and Book of the Year at the Australian Book Industry Awards.



With her sparkling sense of humour, a new book just released and loved by Australians everywhere, Magda filled the shoes of Ambassador perfectly.

"At four years old I could read, and I've been a keen reader ever since. And I would actually say that that effort that my mother put in in those early years – this is in 1965 – very much laid the foundation for my later career, in terms of a love of words, a love of reading. Everything I've done has been involved with the reading of scripts, of plays, of films – and, now, the writing of a book. So...you can't underestimate how important reading is. But I'm also very much of the view that we're surrounded by visual images, but the only way I can tell you what's going on in my head and in my heart is through words. As we say, 'use your words." 

The 2016 Reading Hour was held on Tuesday the 16th of August. It is promoted as a synchronised event, whereby a myriad of participants such as libraries, schools, book clubs, community groups and families gather across the country to spend time with each other and hundreds of different fictional characters and stories. The event's intended hour is always encouraged to be flexible. We told participants and interested reading communities that it could be anytime that week as the concept is to incorporate reading into every day, but on this one day in particular you can be a part of something bigger.

The Reading Hour is a year-round effort to promote reading in every day life, and its featured hour acts as a beacon in the campaign where we can measure engagement and participation rates, and get a feel for the true impact of the initiative. The graph below indicates a large spike in web traffic to the Love2Read Facebook page on the 16th August 2016.



Magda participated in two fun story time events for this year's Reading Hour. The official event was held at the Elsternwhick Library between 11 am and 12pm, where Magda did a reading of 'Ten Little Fingers, Ten Little Toes' and had a sing along with the help of Blinky Bill and the librarians.

The second event was held at St. Kilda Library as a bedtime story time between 6pm to 7pm. Madga read 'Where is the Green Sheep?', participated in more songs and had a ball dancing with the children. Promoting the importance of reading with ease by relating her own stories of her mum reading to her as a child, Madga had the two venues inspired, leading the events to be a great success on the day.



Thanks to the generous support of CAL Cultural Fund Australian authors and illustrators participated in TRH events around the country.

In addition to our beloved ambassador, we engaged Australian authors to participate in local events, which proved to be very successful.



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
